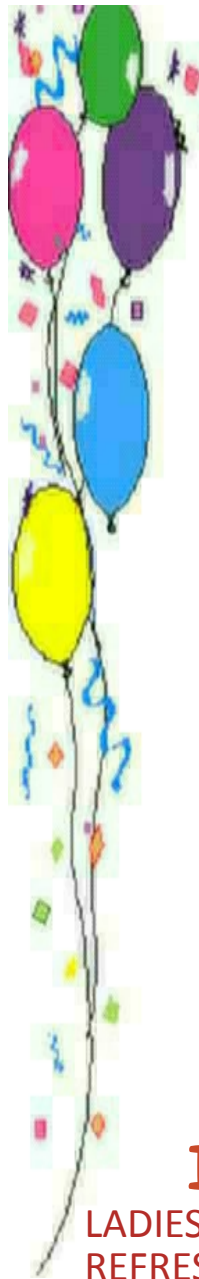
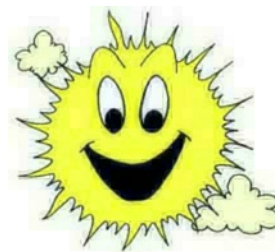

If anyone has a copy, I'd love it for my archives.

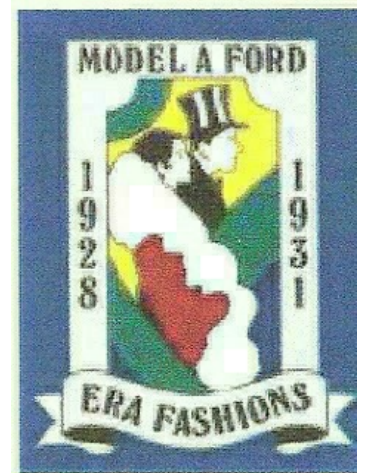

How To Do Finger Wave Hairstyles

Effect of Pin Curls
There are a number of pin curl patterns designed to achieve a specific effect, several of which are illustrated here. However, care must be taken that the curls lie evenly and are placed in the direction in which they are intended to be combed; otherwise, a haphazard setting will result, with uneven wave or curl design.

Vertical Waves
To achieve a vertical wave effect on the left side of the head, first give a reverse shaping, then follow pin curl pattern as illustrated.

Horizontal Waves
To achieve horizontal waves, the hair is first shaped in a forward semi-circular effect from the hair part downward. The pin curls are then set as illustrated. This creates a long-lasting wave close to the head.

HAIRSTYLING

Diagonal Waves
To achieve diagonal waves, shape hair, set pin curls forward and backward in alternating rows and comb out on diagonal waves.

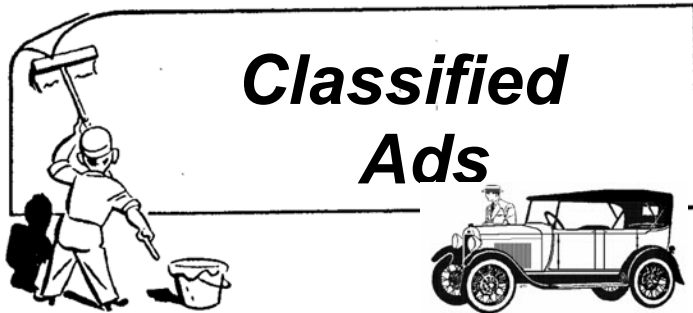

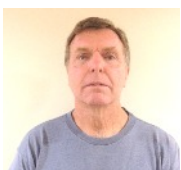

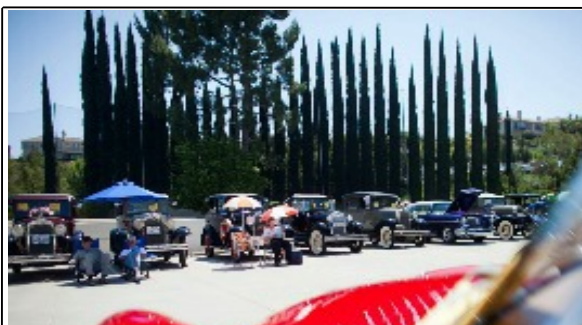


BOB'S MAY BREAKFAST RUN

Help serve them who served us

To members of the San Fernando MAFC intending to participate in the Fourth of July Parade:

As some of you may know, we have invited some local Wounded Warriors and their families to join us for the Newhall Fourth of July Parade and the picnic following at the Moshers.

I have made the contact with the Wounded Warriors Project in San Diego. They are now waiting for us to identify how many cars/seats will be available to take these families, then they will extend the invitation to some of their local members.

If you have a 'suitable' * car with room for one or more guests, please let me know if you would be willing to take a Wounded Warrior guest. The guest may be a former service member or spouse or children. It is probable that we will break up family groups into more than one car, so just one seat would be great, if you can spare it.

* a 'suitable' car would be almost any Model A, except a pickup, unless you have an empty front seat. We would not expect one of our guests to ride in the bed, which isn't legal, anyway.

Rumble seats would be OK, as kids would probably enjoy that the most. Also, if you have a rumble seat, maybe your spouse would be willing to ride there and let a guest ride up front. It is your call.

We have no idea what the response to this invitation will be. However, we want to try it and see if we can bring a new experience to a service person and his or her family in repayment for what they have sacrificed for us. If you feel like you would care to help repay this debt in this small way -- to tell a wounded family that you care about them, then please respond to my request.

Let me know what kind of car you'll be driving and how many seats available. We will assume that some of the wounded vets will not want to attempt to ride in a rumble seat, but their family members might. Let me know if the seat, or seats are rumble seats, so that we can let the Project manager know what to expect.

Thanks to all of you for taking the time to consider my proposal and especially thanks to those who will participate in this experiment of outreach to the suffering. There is no telling what this experiment will portend for the future.

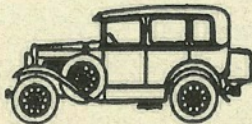

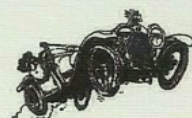

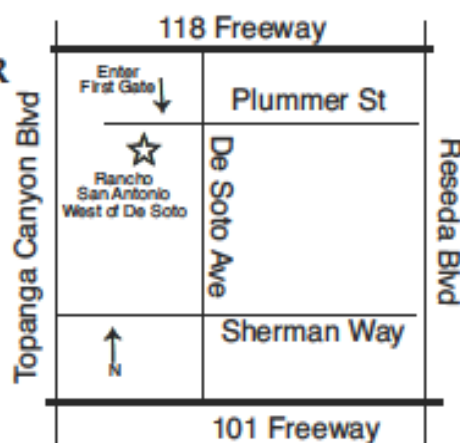
